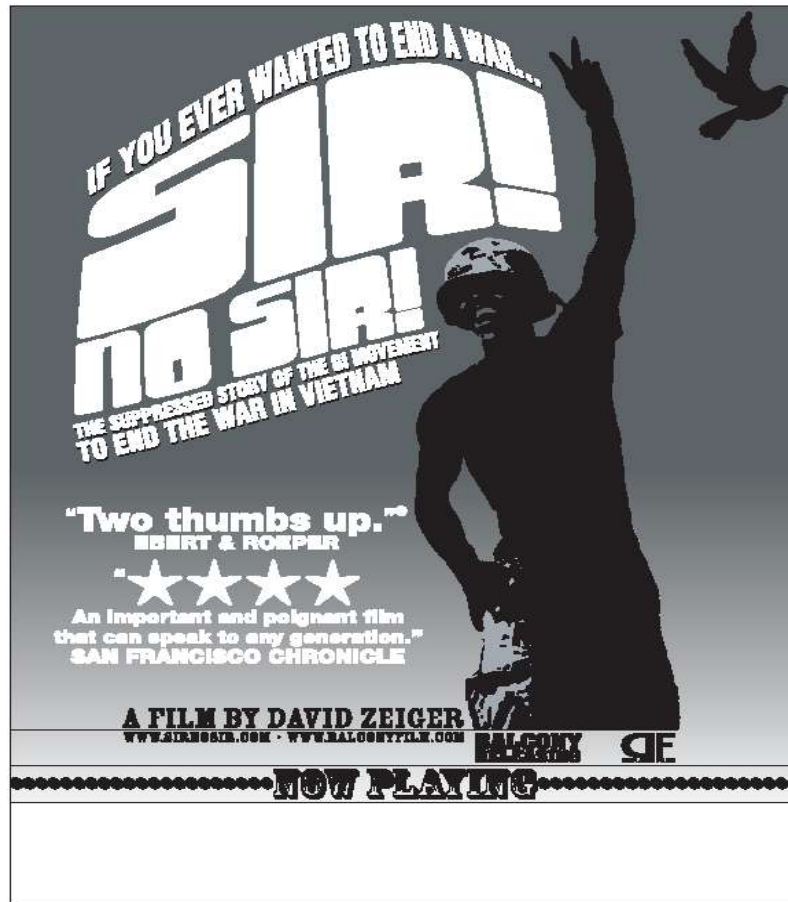


FREE SHOWING!!!
